Upcoming works

We're improving safety for school children and pedestrians along Croydon Road, as part of the Targeted Road Safety Works Program to deliver shovel-infrastructure projects and urgent road safety improvements in Victoria.



What we're doing

To make the road environment safer for pedestrians, cyclists and local school children, we're:

- installing a new electronic speed limit sign on Croydon Road near Kitchener Street, at the existing 40km/h school speed zone

The existing school speed zone is on Croydon Road between Kitchener Street and Wicklow Avenue.

The speed limit is reduced from 60km/h to 40km/h during school drop off times (8am-9.30am) and school pick up times (2.30pm-4pm).

Flashing electronic speed limit signs will help remind drivers to slow down to 40km/h and look out for pedestrians as they approach Croydon Primary School.

When to expect us

Works will take place on Wednesday 16 June and Thursday 17 June between 9.30am and 3.30pm, weather permitting.

What traffic impacts can I expect?

During works, there will be a speed reduction in place to keep our crews safe.

Why we're doing this

Infrastructure plays a vital role in keeping you safe on our roads.

By installing new safety features on Croydon Road in Croydon, we can improve pedestrian safety, prevent serious crashes from happening or reduce the severity of crashes when they're unavoidable.

Croydon Road will be made safer thanks to the \$157,000 investment through the joint Victorian and Australian Government's Targeted Road Safety Works program.
