Additional Information

Loads that cross railways or tramways in Victoria and exceed dimensions prescribed under the Transport (Compliance and Miscellaneous) Act 1983 require a permit. Over dimensional load permits contain conditions that users must follow to ensure the safe movement of vehicles, freight and large loads over railways and tramways in Victoria. All permit applications must be submitted at least five business days before the intended date of travel.

Penalties: The following penalties are prescribed under the Transport (Compliance and Miscellaneous) Act 1983. Failure to obtain or comply with the conditions of a permit may result in penalties of up to \$3,304.00 (from 1 July 2020). Providing false or misleading information may result in penalties of up to \$49,566.00 in the case of a corporation, or maximum 6 months imprisonment or \$9913.20 or both in any other case. Any damage caused to public or private infrastructure may result in prosecution and may render insurance policies null and void.

Additional fee: An invoice for outstanding department or transport operator attendance fees will be issued by the department following the crossing. Instructions on how to make payment will be included in the invoice.
