1. You need to download this form and fill in the correct sections. The form will need to be uploaded to vicroads.vic.gov.au/tow-truck-upload, along with the supporting documentation to support your exemption application. You will have to pay a fee when you submit your documents. Once the application is submitted, you will receive a confirmation email from VicRoads.
2. A non refundable application fee is payable to VicRoads. This fee is for processing your application.

Please ensure that all sections of the application form are completed and signed where applicable and that the appropriate documentation and fees as detailed on the reverse side of this form accompany the application.

Tow truck specifications, maintenance and equipment requirements:

1. The operator of a tow truck must ensure that the tow truck:
 - (a) has a load capacity of at least 1.25 tonnes;
 - (b) has dual tyres on each side of each axle on the wheels or the rear axle group;
 - (c) is fitted with a crane which complies with the the Vehicle Standards Bulletin 6 (VSB6) or a winch, hoist, ramp or other lifting device which has a safe working load of not less than 1.25 tonnes;
 - (d) is equipped with a broom, shovel and durable rubbish receptacle for the removal of debris and glass from highway;
 - (e) is equipped with either a fully maintained foam fire extinguisher of at least 4.5 litres capacity or a dry chemical powder fire extinguisher of at least 4.5 kilograms capacity;
 - (f) is fitted with a flashing or rotating amber warning lights or lights approved by the licensing authority; and
 - (g) is fitted with two (2) fully adjustable lights mounted so that the operator will have sufficient illumination to safely load or unload a damaged motor vehicle when it is dark.
2. The operator of a tow truck must ensure that the equipment required to be fitted to a tow truck is maintained in a serviceable condition.
